## The Athlete's Oath:

## Event 1: Taboo

## Event 2: Descriptive Drawing

- Both teams will choose which group drew the best picture.
- I will judge whose picture is the best, and that team wins

- If the representatives HAVE done this, they have to put a finger down.

## Torch Relay

- For the flame to travel to Rio, over 12,000 people were torchbearers.
- The flame traveled over $20,000 \mathrm{~km}$ ( miles) from Greece all the way to Rio.
- It took 106 days for the Olympic flame to travel to Rio.


## Torch Route



- Traveled from Olympia, Greece, to Switzerland, to Brazil.
- Once in Brazil, the torch flame traveled all over the country and ended in Rio.


## Who carries the flame?

- Requirements:
- Must be at least 14 years old
- Must be able to carry the torch for 400 meters (437 yards)
*Usually a person is chosen because they have made a significant contribution to their community.

## Opening Ceremonies August 5th

- Long distance runner Vanderlei Cordeiro de Lima was the last torchbearer, who ignited the Olympic cauldron, a stunning mirrored pyre.
- The Olympian had suffered heartbreak in Athens in 2004 when he was attacked by an intruder while in the lead in the marathon but still managed to win bronze.
- He has since become synonymous with sportsmanship and perseverance.
