Change is fun and exciting.




A busy life is good.

VALUES AUCTION

- An auction is like a market.
- At an auction, people place **bids** on items or things that they want to buy.
- · At an auction many people can make offers, but only one person will get to buy the item in the end.
- We will have an auction where you and your group will have a chance to place a bid on some items.



PICK YOUR VALUES

- With your group, look at the list of values and decide which ones are the most important.
- Choose 8-10 values that your group would like to bid and purchase.
- Write the amount you are willing to pay for each value.
 You only have 100 points to spend.

AUCTION TIME

- Listen carefully to each value that will be up for bidding. If you would like to place a bid, you need to raise your hand and say the price you are willing to pay. The group with the highest price wins the bid!
- Each value can only be sold once! So your group will need to decide which ones are most important.
